#### **ABOUT THE SOCIETY**

The Society is the oldest learned society in the Southern Hemisphere, tracing its origin to the *Philosophical Society of Australasia*, founded in Sydney in 1821. It became *the Royal Society of New South Wales* by Royal Assent in 1866 and was incorporated by an Act of the NSW Parliament in 1881. The Society exists for ...the encouragement of studies and investigations in Science Art Literature and Philosophy..., in particular: publishing results of scientific investigations in its Journal and Proceedings; conducting monthly meetings; awarding prizes and medals; and by liaison with other learned societies within Australia and internationally.

The Society held the second of its Forums on 4 April 2012 at the Powerhouse Museum. Robyn Williams AM moderated a lively discussion between Mark Scott AO, Managing Director of the ABC, and Prof. Jill Trewhella FRSN, Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Research) at the University of Sydney. Their topic was *The media and scientific research: impact and influences*.

The annual Four Societies Lecture was held on 27 February 2013 in conjunction with the Nuclear Engineering Panel of the Sydney Branch of Engineers Australia, the Australian Nuclear Association and the Australian Institute of Energy. This year's lecture was delivered by Prof. Stefaan Simons. His topic was *Going low carbon – the approach of the International Energy Policy Institute*.

The Society was pleased to hold the Dirac Lecture in conjunction with the University of New South Wales and the Australian Institute of Physics. This year Prof. Brian Schmidt AC FAA FRSN, 2011 Nobel Laureate for Physics and newly-appointed Fellow of the Society, delivered the lecture entitled *The accelerating universe*, to a packed auditorium.

The 2012 Liversidge Lecture was delivered by Prof. Thomas Maschmeyer from the University of Sydney. His topic was *Low carbon technologies: from brown coal and biomass to solar hydrogen*. The Society is grateful to the Faculty of Science, the University of Sydney in supporting this lecture.

The Society held its Christmas Party at St Paul's College, University of Sydney, on Wednesday 5 December 2012. The event was preceded by the presentation of the 2012 Jak Kelly Award, by Prof. Kelly's widow, Mrs Irene Kelly.

As a departure from previous years, an Advisory Panel of the Chief Scientist and Engineer of NSW, Prof Mary O'Kane, and the Deans of the Science faculties of NSW universities was invited to participate in the process. When nominations for the awards of the Society were all received, a meeting of the Advisory panel with Prof Hibbert in attendance ranked the candidates and gave advice on their merits. This was communicated to the Awards Committee who made final recommendations to the Council. The process was most effective and allowed high-quality, confidential advice to be given to the Society with several exceptional scientists being recommended for consideration. Prof O'Kane generously provided both a venue for the meeting and excellent leadership of the Advisory Panel.

At the meeting held on Tuesday, 30 November 2012, the Council made three awards. They were:

Clarke Medal (zoology) Professor Marilyn Renfree FAA

Of particular note is the award of the Royal Society of New South Wales Medal to John Hardie, by special resolution of Council, for his contribution to the Society for over thirty years, six of which were as its President.

The awards will be presented at the Annual Dinner to be held on Friday 19 April.

The winner of the inaugural Jak Kelly award made by the Royal Society of NSW in conjunction with the Australian Institute of Physics was Mr Andrew Ong. Mr Ong gave a presentation on his work and was presented with the award by Mrs Irene Kelly at the general meeting held on Wednesday, 5 December 2012

The Society's Scholarships for 2012 were awarded to Ms Jendi Kepple, Ms Anwen Krause-Heuer and Ms Helen Margherita Smith. Each of the scholarship winners made presentations on their research work at the general meeting held on Wednesday, 6 February 2013.

#### JOURNAL AND PROCEEDINGS

Two editions of the *Journal and Proceedings* were published in 2012. Vol 145, Nos 443 & 444 contained five peer-reviewed papers and six thesis abstracts. The refereed papers concerned an optical-infrared telescope proposal for the Antarctic, the treatment of cancer using alpha radiotherapy, the etymology of dragonfly names, a newly discovered photograph of Rev WB Clarke, one of the founding fathers of the Society and reported work done at the University of Western Sydney on high-energy lasers. This edition also reintroduced publication of the Society's proceedings.

Prof. Michael Burton from the School of Physics, UNSW, was appointed to the position of Editor of the *Journal and Proceedings* in mid-2012, succeeding Dr Hector. One edition (Vol 145, Nos 445 & 446) has been published since. Five refereed papers and three thesis abstracts were published in this Edition. Three of the refereed papers concerned the history of Parramatta Observatory and Governor Brisbane in the early days of the Colony of NSW. It followed from a Symposium co-sponsored by the RSNSW in 2011 on this subject. One paper provided a review of the first decade of research at the National Maritime Research Centre in Coffs Harbour. The final refereed paper concerned monitoring of the Murray Cod.

The first edition of 2013, Vol 146, Nos 447 & 448, is planned for mid-year. To date, two papers are with referees, and correspondence is underway with the authors of three further prospective refereed papers. Abstracts for two PhD theses have also been received.

The Society expects to include in the second edition of 2013 (Vol 146,Nos 449 & 450) several articles for a special edition in memory of Prof. Jak Kelly, a former President of the Society as well as a former Head of School of Physics at UNSW. Four authors have promised articles to date.

For 2013 a marketing program for the *Journal and Proceedings* is being planned. Publicity material on the *Journal and Proceedings* is being prepared for distribution through the Faculties of Science at NSW universities.

Consideration is also being given to the archiving and indexing of the Journal by science citation services, and how this might best be accomplished.

The Journal will continue to be published both in print and online forms. However to control escalating costs, in future the print edition will only be produced for direct subscribers to the *Journal and Proceedings*, and not automatically sent to all members. The online edition will be freely available to all members of the Society.

Members are encouraged to consider publication of their own research investigations in the Society's *Journal and Proceedings*!
